

# Child Nutrition Access and Accountability Through Technology Training

## Overview

The annual Child Nutrition Access and Accountability Through Technology (known as CNAAT) National Training Conference provides a forum for attendees to learn new skills, share successful practices, and collaborate on important issues that shape child nutrition technologies. Participants represent school food authorities, information technology (IT), child and nutrition agencies, and USDA Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) national and regional staff. Nutrition programs discussed at the conference are the National School Lunch Program, the School Breakfast Program, the Child and Adult Care Food Program, the Summer Food Service Program, the Fresh Fruit and Vegetables Program, and the Special Milk Program.
